Ms. Sarratore said that they would be looking to offer scholarships for students involved in this program, be it for college, trade school or a leadership academy. Monies could also could be put towards the next project. She said that the idea is for this to be a student-run, student-led coffee shop. There would be some paid employees to help offset hours, but the bulk of this would be volunteer led.

Dr. Piazza said that this project is highly academic driven, and said that this was in the presentation given at the last Board of Education meeting when the idea was first formally presented.
